

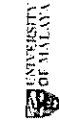

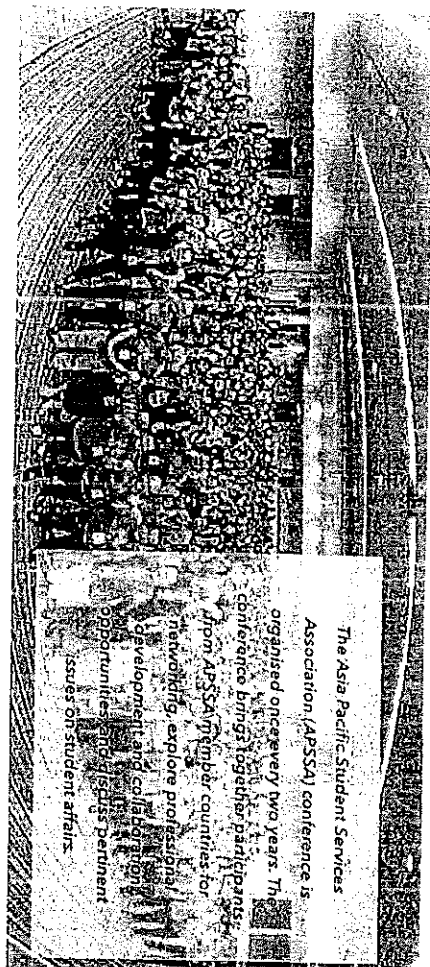

The 16th APSSA conference will be held at Universiti Teknologi Malaysia, Kuala Lumpur campus from 6-10 August 2018. It comprises of two conferences:

STAFF CONFERENCE

Students are at the heart and soul of student affairs professionals. The diverse student body demands passion, diligence and strong commitment from these professionals in their day to day operations. They are the driving forces behind student success, providing the best of services and assistance to the student population.

The 4th Industrial Revolution impact higher education is significant and profound. As a result, issues and challenges faced by student affairs professionals today may be different from those experienced in the past. Amidst rapid technological, reduced funding and greater interdependency among stakeholders, these professionals need to swiftly adapt to change and deliver through innovative networks such as the Asia Pacific Student Services Association (APSSA). The student affairs professionals are able to build connections and collaborate with one another existing them to be engaged in current developments related to their core work, students with expanding their personal and professional development through peer learning and exchange of experience.

The 16th APSSA International Conference 2018 calls for participants to look at the changing roles of student affairs and work collectively towards development of holistic, balanced and entrepreneurial students with the right attitude and competencies for the 21st century. The theme "Engage, Empower, Evolve: Pushing the Frontiers of Student Affairs" was specially chosen in view of current and higher education, which affect student affairs professionals irrespective of geographical contexts and higher education systems. It is hoped that participants have to better connect with their stakeholders, engaged in their line of work, formalized, and are eager to embrace transformational changes at the end of the conference. It is hoped that participants would have a renewed sense of purpose towards their role. This would then empower them to identify fresh insights, innovative approaches and room for improvement for the benefit of students under their care.

SUBTHEMES

Five subthemes have been identified for the staff conference of the 16th APSSA International Conference 2018. The five subthemes are as follows:

1. EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES

This subtheme focuses on the role of student affairs professionals in supporting students' career development. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, graduate employability, employer engagement, career interests, entrepreneurial ventures, innovation and financial literacy, as well as innovative models to prepare students for their future careers.

2. CAREER CHALLENGES AND OPPORTUNITIES

This subtheme concentrates on the role of student affairs professionals in monitoring and supporting students' mental health and well-being under this subtheme include, but not limited to, counselling, mental healthcare services, mental health awareness, as well as peer structures, pastoral care, religious guidelines and other forms of support for students in need.

3. SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

This subtheme focuses on the responsibility of both on and off-campus student residence and its management. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, building models, priority development, maintenance, options for future generation, as well as future trends in student residence development among property developers and private operators.

ENGAGE, EMPOWER, EVOLVE Pushing the Frontiers of Student Affairs

The five subthemes are as follows:

1. BUILDING THROUGH STUDENT DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMS

This subtheme discusses on student development through a strategic approach, with the ultimate objective of nurturing students who are and lead with a purpose towards their peers and communities. Discussion under this subtheme include, but not limited to, strategies in student development, high impact student development activities, alignment of student development initiatives to national and regional agendas, as well as recent trends in student development.

2. ACROSS AND DIVERSITY - Developing Global Citizens

This subtheme zooms in on strategies and initiatives in enabling students for aspirational learning and appreciation towards cultural differences and diverse perspectives. Discussion under this subtheme include, but not limited to, inbound and outbound student mobility programmes based on balanced mobility, students' intercultural learning, as well as approaches in addressing access and participation in student mobility programmes.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Student Affairs professionals, lecturers, housing, gatekeepers, counsellors, professional staff in student mobility programmes and other practitioners within tertiary level. Invited, the above-mentioned subthemes.

STUDENT CONFERENCE

Students today maintain multiple identities. They learn, interact and connect with each other, as well as with the world around them not just through face-to-face encounters, but also through the screens on their mobile phones. As a result, their knowledge structure, belief systems, and how they respond to the environment are also shaped by their interactions, both online and offline.

The 4th Industrial Revolution redefines the world of work, social norms and conventions, and economic development for our students. Graduates of higher learning are capable of, and will be able to help them to manage the swift transformation. That said, there is a limit to what the institutions can do for the students. They should be aware of who they are, what they can do, and the identities that they represent in the society. Additionally, they need to have the resilience to face an uncertain yet exciting future, and the conviction that they can address those challenges with their own effort and wisdom.

The 16th APSSA International Conference 2018 highlights pertinent issues for discussion in the student track of the conference. It is argued that participants have to look back at their own experiences (reflect), identify ways to reach out and act (respond), and look at their roles and responsibilities in a different light (reflex). It is hoped that the conference would enable participants to share experiences, context-specific lessons, and best practices in which could be implemented at their institutions post-conference. They would then be able to work effectively with student affairs professionals for the benefit of the greater student population.

SUBTHEMES

Four subthemes have been identified for the student conference of the 16th APSSA International Conference 2018. The subthemes are as follows:

1. SUSTAINABILITY

This subtheme deals with the students' role in ensuring ethical, responsible, and mindful use of social media. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, using patterns and strategies, case studies and lessons learnt in the use of social media, responsibility in sharing accurate and verified information sources, as well as tips in organising successful outreach on social media.

2. PHYSICAL AND MENTAL WELLNESS

This subtheme prompts the students to look at how they manage their stress, their relations with their peers and others around them, and their roles within their communities. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, students' inter-personal competencies, students' social safety net, gaps to be highlighted to student affairs professionals with regard to physical and mental wellness, as well as peer support and network in ensuring good physical and mental wellness.

3. YOU ARE AND THE BORN/BOUNDED

This subtheme encourages the students to deliberate on issues related to environmental sustainability. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, education for sustainable development (E4SD), disaster management, and mitigation, environmental responsibility organised by student societies, as well as other issues related to environmental sustainability.

4. RECORDING AN ENGAGED GLOBAL CITIZEN

This subtheme underscores the students' role in exploring their international perspectives and contextual complexities. Discussions under this subtheme include, but not limited to, their understanding towards current local, economic, political and environmental developments and implications about the world, integration between domestic and international students, participation in student mobility programmes, as well as national unity and energy.
